



While networking is a centerpiece of nearly all our programs, many programs are specifically designed to deliver "bottom line enhancing" information and resources. From marketing to employment law, tax updates and business planning, the Chamber offers many educational seminars and workshops

The Chamber's **Academy for Business Excellence** offers a robust curriculum ideal for both business owners as well as employees. Attendees are provided topical, practical, and useable information that gives their business or organization a competitive advantage. The Academy focuses on "how-to" workshops as well as a broad variety of state and national economic issues.
